Bio for Tedd Weyman Field Investigations' Team Lead Uranium Medical Research Centre

The Uranium Medical Research Centre is a non-profit, clinical and scientific research organisation incorporated in Canada, England and the United States with field offices in Afghanistan and Abu Dhabi. Headed by International Research Director, Dr. Asaf Durakovic, UMRC conducts radiological and clinical studies and advanced medical diagnostic consulting of individuals and populations presenting with the symptoms and/or a history of exposure to radionuclides. UMRC specialises in the measurement and analysis of uranium internal contamination via inhalation of artificially dispersed radiotoxic and chemotoxic heavy metals and the medical consequences of the deployment of battlefield uranium weapons.

Tedd Weyman, BSW, MEd (HROD), is UMRC's Deputy Director and Field Investigations Team Lead. Tedd organises and leads UMRC's field studies in Afghanistan, Iraq and Palestine. He is also a consultant in CBRN and terrorism emergency management, integrated municipal emergency services, and rural-area community capacity building. The accompanying photo shows Tedd collecting post-ballistic debris samples at a Taliban army depot bombed by Operation Enduring Freedom on the outskirts of Jalalabad. Since this photo was taken, this bombsite was confirmed by laboratory analysis to contain nondepleted uranium at levels elevated 57 times normal.
